In light of recent national school tragedies, it is time to revisit school procedures and take a closer look at the needs and

circumstances of our students with disabilities.

The 2018 Idaho legislative session has come to an end, and once again, the health insurance coverage gap remained without a solution. Despite strong testimony in support of the Idaho Health Care Plan, the bill was sent back to committee without a vote on March 21, 2018.

Betsy Russell's 'Eye on Boise' blog in the Spokesman-Review captured quotes from local leaders and advocates on their feelings about the situation. "It is incredibly disappointing that our Legis lature wouldn't even give the Idaho Health Care Plan a vote today," said Neva Santos, Executive Director of the Idaho Academy of Family Physicians. "Multiple representatives fought for their constituents today before leadership decided they would kill this bill. Thirty-five thousand more Idahoans could have had health insurance, premiums could have been so much lower for folks that need that relief next year. Instead people will remain uninsured and health care costs will continue to rise."

Jim Baugh, Executive Director of Disability Rights Idaho, said, "This is disappointing because we know many Idahoans with mental and behavioral health issues are living in the coverage gap. This plan could have been a way to help many Idahoans struggling with mental illness to buy health insurance, and get at least some of the treatment they need. It isn't right that they have to face another year of suffering in the gap because leadership didn't want to take a vote."

Youth Corner

Idaho Youth, this one's for you! Check out this awesome opportunity shared by the State Independent Living Council:

Idaho Youth Leadership Forum (IDYLF) is a career and civic leadership training program for high school juniors and seniors with disabilities. IDYLF provides young people with disabilities (delegates) the opportunity to learn full citizenship skills, including advocacy, leadership, community participation and employment skills.

The delegates are high school juniors and seniors from around the state of Idaho who have been chosen based on their application, interview and letters of recommendation. This program is a six day hands on program where the delegate will get a feel for college life.

Delegates leave IDYLF equipped with:

- Leadership plans to implement upon return to their community. Academic and career goals.
- Work ethics and a belief that work is not only a right, but also a social obligation to reach his/her full potential.
- A resource development plan in order to attain continued or more complete independence through technology, community support peer mentoring.

The Youth Leadership Forum (YLF) was developed by the California Governor's Committee for Employment of Persons with Disability in 1992. Since then, more than 35 states, including the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico have implemented YLF in their state. YLF was highly successful in Idaho until 2012 when it was discontinued due to limited resources. We're excited for its return in 2018!

The Idaho Youth Leadership Forum (YLF) will take place at Boise State University July 8-13th. There is an application at the website below and you can get help with the application through the Disability Action Center in Post Falls (208.664.9896). If a student is not doing summer work through VR they really should apply to this program.

There is no cost for the program, all expenses are paid! Applications must be postmarked April 15, 2018.

YLF would like to have applicants from our region represented at the conference.


VSA Idaho - The State Organization on Art and Disability.

This winter in Notus Idaho, sixth grade students welcomed teaching artist Helen Grainger Wilson in a multi-day visual arts residency. Students learned methods and techniques for drawing and painting wildlife found in Idaho's native landscape such as the red fox shown in these photographs. Participants also produced self portraits from photographs in colored pencil, and they learned how to write a professional artist statement. This residency was tied to academic grade level curriculum for biology, English and arts and humanities state standards. Studies show arts integrated curriculum strengthens knowledge and memory in students, enhancing their artistic and critical thinking skills.
